

[High Schools: Ella Guidaboni's goal lifts Turners Falls past Mohawk Trail for 1st win](#)

Ella Guidaboni buried a penalty stroke in the waning minutes of regulation, and the visiting Turners Falls field hockey team won their first game of the season on Friday.

Guidaboni's goal broke a scoreless tie and lifted the Thunder to a 1-0 Valley League victory over Mohawk Trail in Buckland.

Turners held a 12-7 edge in penalty corners, improving to 1-4-1 overall with the victory.
